The 2017 Missouri State Scholastic Chess Championship is scheduled for March 18, 2017, returning to Battle High School in Columbia, Missouri. This is the largest annual chess tournament in Missouri, averaging over 500 participants from all corners of the state and is the official championship event organized and sanctioned by the Missouri Chess Association (www.mochess.org).

We are sending this invitation to more than 1,000 chess club sponsors and school officials at as many elementary, middle, and high schools as possible. Students from all Missouri schools grades K-12 are eligible to participate. Your help in encouraging your students and others in your district to participate is essential to making this event successful.

You will find eligibility, format, and registration information in this brochure. Due to continued positive feedback from previous years, the High School section of the State Championship will again be a rated event sanctioned by the United States Chess Federation (USCF). In an effort to allow as many students to enter as possible, the Missouri Chess Association is sponsoring a portion of the USCF membership dues for players without a current membership.

We are also pleased to announce that the Missouri High School Tournament of Champions (qualifier for the National Denker Tournament of Champions) and the All- Girls State Championship will both be held on April 1, 2017 at the Parkade Center in Columbia, Missouri. So please mark your calendars!

REGISTRATION

Tournament registration will be from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. the day of the tournament. Registration in advance is recommended. Go to mochess.org and follow the instructions. The deadline for advance registration is 6 p.m., Friday, March 17, 2017.

ENTRY FEE

The entry fee is \$20 per player registered in advance or before 9:30a.m. the day of the tournament. The entry fee is \$30 for players who either begin registration after 9:30 a.m. or who pay the cashier after 10 a.m. Players who begin registration after 10 a.m. will not be paired in Round One. High school players that are not currently USCF members will pay an additional \$5.

TEAM ROOM RESERVATIONS

ELIGIBILITY

All students in kindergarten through grade 12 are eligible. Schools may not enter teams in divisions that include grades higher than the highest grade in the school that the team represents.

SPONSORS/COACHES

Each school must have either a sponsor or parent present. There will be a meeting for sponsors and parents during Round One.

UNDER DIVISIONS

FORMAT

The tournament format is the same for all divisions (**K-3**, **K-5**, **K-6**, **K-8**, and **K-9**). They will be played in six rounds at 10:30 a.m., 12 p.m., 1:30 p.m., 3 p.m., 4:30 p.m. and 6 p.m., with the last round beginning early if possible. Each school may enter any number of players. The school score is the sum of the four highest player scores. Four school plaques and ten individual trophies will be awarded. The time control is game in 30 minutes. Players may be paired with players in other divisions. Under Sections are not USCF Rated.

RATINGS

United States Chess Federation ratings will be used if possible. Grade 12 students without ratings will be assigned a rating of 800, grade 11 students without ratings will be assigned a rating of 750, and so forth.

TIE BREAKS

Ties will be broken using the Solkoff System, the Sonneboern-Berger System, the Median System and the Cumulative System.

AWARD PRESENTATIONS

7:30 p.m. — Awards will be presented for the Under Divisions (**K-3**, **K-5**, **K-6**, **K-8**, and **K-9**).

8:30 p.m. — Awards will be presented to the High School Division.

No awards will be presented before these times.

HIGH SCHOOL DIVISION

FORMAT

The tournament will be played in four rounds at 10:30 a.m., 1 p.m., 3:30 p.m. and 6 p.m., with the last round beginning early if possible. Students in grades nine through twelve are eligible. Each school may enter any number of four-player teams and a partial team. The best player on each team should be assigned to board one; the second-best player should be assigned to board two, and so forth. A school that enters only a partial team must assign the players to the highest boards, and a school that enters a partial team in addition to one or more full teams must assign the players to the lowest boards. The school score is the sum of the best scores on each board. Eight school plaques and eight individual trophies per board will be awarded. The time control is game in 60 minutes. High School Section is USCF Rated.
